Board Minutes Summary

The official minutes of the Portland Public Schools Custodian Civil Service Board are sound and recorded in the minutes (the volume) in a summary of the April 12, 2023, meeting.

A meeting of the Portland Public Schools Custodian Civil Service Board was held on April 12, 2023, via Zoom. Mr. Moran, Ms. Eavitt and Ms. Racie Pietra hosted the meeting remotely from their offices in the Blanchard Education Service Center, 10110 Division Street, Portland, Oregon (CCSB Chair Brian Caulfield, Board Member Baird Cusack, and Board Secretary Don McClain attended via Zoom. The presiding officer of the meeting was Brian Caulfield (Stace Wurra), director of human resources, PPS.

The meeting was called to order at 3:02 p.m.

#### OLD BUSINESS

##### 1. Approval of Proposed Minutes

The minutes of the March 29, 2023 meeting were approved as read.

##### 2. Approval of Hiring List

Moran, Eavitt introduced Racie Pietra, superintendent in recruitment and hiring is one of the main reasons PPS has been filling more positions, and that her expertise has speeded up the hiring process significantly. (Stace Wurra is the Director of Recruitment and Human Resources and has also been a huge help with the hiring process.)

Statistics provided by Eavitt for the 3/29 meeting included 3 applicants, 22 jobs too, the test, 9 were interviewed, and 9 candidates are on the hiring list (the average test score) as 99.2%, the average interview score) as 90.7%, and the overall average) as 79.1%.
